## The History and Geography of World War II: The War in England and France

July 6-20, 2010 (Travel: July 9-20)

A Learning Trip to: London, Brighton, Portsmouth, Southampton, Caen, Normandy Beaches, Bayeux, St. Mere Eglise, Paris

### The Experience

Join Salem State College professors Stephen Matchak and Christopher Mauriello to study the history and geography of World War II from London to Paris. After three intensive days of classes studying the Battle of Britain, preparations for the D-Day invasion, the Allied landings at Normandy and the breakout into France, we will travel to Europe to explore small and large cities and towns in England and France including:

- London, England
- Brighton, Portsmouth and Southampton, England
- Caen and Bayeux, France
- Omaha and Utah Beaches, Normandy, France
- St Mere Eglise, France
- Paris, France

From 1940-1944 the main theatre of operations for WWII in Western Europe was in England and France. German planes relentlessly bombed London in the Battle of Britain, the largest invasion force in history assembled in the coastal towns of England, allied forces stormed the beaches at Normandy, and then pushed inland fighting key battles through cities and towns such as Caen and St. Mere Eglise.

Come with us to explore history and geography of these dramatic events. Walking tours include battlefields, museums, cemeteries, memorials, historic sites, art, architecture, and urban geography. We will also have plenty of time to explore the diversity of music, food and culture in larger and smaller cities and towns. Students and teachers from many disciplines are welcome.

The institute has an interdisciplinary approach that includes many of the liberal arts and meets many of the Massachusetts educational frameworks for history and social studies.

Credit available includes 3 or 6 undergraduate, 3 or 6 graduate, or up to 45 PDP's in geography, history or education.

### Course Information

Students must complete three days of seminar-style institute classes before departure. These sessions will use multimedia presentations, readings and discussion to explore the history and geography of World War II. In addition, these sessions will review the academic requirements and due dates for institute portfolio and the travel aspects of the seminar. Note: The trip is a required component of the institute and must be taken to receive credit or PDPs for this institute.

Dates of class are: July 6, 7 and 8. The travel portion of the institute is from July 9-20. All students must attend all days of the study/travel institute classes to receive credit. Travelers joining the trip but not taking the institute for credit are welcome to attend the seminars.
