## The Experience

Join Salem State University professors Stephen Matchak and Christopher Mauriello to study the history and geography of the Eastern Front during World War II. After two intensive days of classes studying the war in the east, we will travel to the following WWII sites:

- Berlin, Germany (Berlin walking tour, Soviet War Memorial, Memorial to the Murdered Jews of Europe, Reichstag, site of the former Fuhrer Bunker and optional tours of the Berlin Jewish Museum and the German Historical Museum)
- Poznan, Poland (Poznan Citadel, Soviet Memorial and war cemeteries)
- Gierloz, Poland (Hitler's Headquarters – Wolfsschanze or Wolf's Lair)
- Warsaw, Poland (Guided Warsaw tour, former Warsaw Ghetto, Memorial to the Warsaw Rising and optional visits to the Warsaw Rising Museum.
- Krakow, Poland (Krakow walking tour, Jewish Quarter, Church of the Virgin Mary, Wawel Castle and optional tours of Historical Museum of Krakow and Schindler's Factory)
- Auschwitz, Poland (Full day guided tour of the Auschwitz I and Birkenau Concentration Camps)
- Budapest, Hungary (Budapest walking tour, Chain Bridge, Shoes on the Danube Promenade)



A critical theatre of operations for WWII was in Central and Eastern Europe. The “war in the East” began with a massive assault of the German army into Poland in 1939 and ended with the Soviet Red Army pushing back through Hungary and Poland and defeating the Nazi regime in the final battle for Berlin. Join us to explore the history and geography of these dramatic events.

We will explore WWII-related battle sites, memorials, cemeteries and museums, there will be ample time to explore the culture, arts, cuisine and nightlife in Berlin, Poznan, Warsaw, Krakow and Budapest. The institute has an interdisciplinary approach that includes many of the liberal arts and satisfies many of the Massachusetts educational frameworks for history and social studies.

Credit available includes 3 or 6 undergraduate, 3 or 6 graduate, or up to 45 PDP's in geography, history or education.



## Course Information

Note: The trip is a required component of the institute and must be taken to receive credit or PDPs for this institute. Students must complete two days of seminar-style institute classes before departure. These sessions will use multimedia presentations, readings and discussion to explore the history and geography of World War II. In addition, these sessions will review the academic requirements and due dates for institute portfolio and the travel aspects of the seminar.

Dates of classes are: July 2-3. The travel portion of the institute is from July 5-17. All students must attend all days of the study/travel institute classes to receive credit. Travelers joining the trip but not taking the institute for credit are welcome to attend the seminars.

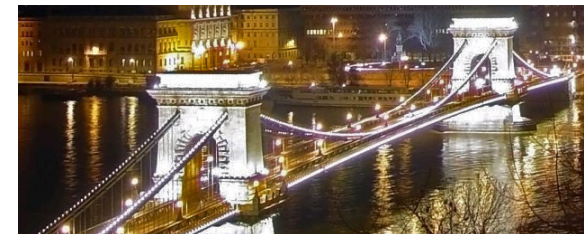
